occurred we were connected with our Sisters of Kolkata, Bihar and Assam through social media. The time has come to direct all our energies to disaster prevention rather than disaster management.

MINISTRIES-ONLINE EDUCATION

For those who are not techno-savvy this was a huge challenge because updating oneself with new technology and getting accustomed to using various new apps was mind boggling. Students too had to be updated with regard to their assignments, projects, etc. It is extremely difficult to keep a track on the students and to check whether they are in tune with what is happening in the school and classroom.



Adaptive learning has taken the role of text books in the classrooms and learning has become self-paced based on individual interests. Although motivational webinars are being conducted regularly for parents and students the task seems to be more and more challenging for a teacher today. But the journey continues. Working with our students enabling them to reach their full potential even when teaching has become so impersonal!
